INCIDENT REPORTING TRAINING FOR PROVIDERS

An updated Incident Reporting Training for providers has been posted to Trillium's My Learning Campus. This is a great training for new staff or for any staff looking to refresh their knowledge. Training certificates are available upon online completion.

The training delivers a condensed summary of information regarding incident reporting. By the end of the training, your staff will be able to:

- Identify the purpose of incident reporting
- Define incidents
- Recognize when an incident report is required
- Navigate the Incident Response Improvement System (IRIS), and
- Understand reporting guidelines

As a reminder, all Level II and Level III incidents must be submitted in IRIS within 72 hours of learning of the incident.

REMINDER: TRILLIUM IS A CLOSED NETWORK FOR BH/SUD/IDD

As a reminder, Trillium operates a closed network for all behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities services. (*N.C. Gen. Stat. 108D-23*). At this time, Trillium is <u>not accepting requests to add new providers</u> to the Trillium behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities provider network outside of a published recruitment opportunity.

Trillium continually assesses the needs of Members and adjusts the network to ensure Members have access to needed services. Current service needs are posted on our <u>Current Service Needs</u> webpage.

Non-Contracted Providers can submit an Interest Submission Form to express future interest in contracting for behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities services. Trillium will review interest submissions on a monthly basis.

NC MEDICAID EARLY AND PERIODIC SCREENING, DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT (EPSDT) BENEFIT FOR CHILDREN

Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) is the federal law (44 CFR Subpart B) that states that Medicaid must provide all medically necessary health care services to Medicaid-eligible children under the age of 21. Even if a service is not covered under the NC Medicaid State Plan, it can be covered for beneficiaries under 21 years of age if the service is listed in 1905(a) of the Social Security Act and if all EPSDT criteria are met.

- The required components of a Health Check visit are:
- Comprehensive health and developmental history that assesses for both physical and mental health, as well as for substance use disorders
- Comprehensive, unclothed physical examination
- Appropriate immunizations in accordance with the schedule for pediatric vaccines established by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices
- Laboratory testing (including blood lead screening appropriate for age and risk factors)
- Health education and anticipatory guidance for both the child and caregiver

DIRECT CARE WORKER REPORTING

Pursuant to the 2023 Appropriations Act, Session Law 2023-134, North Carolina Medicaid established a process for eligible Medicaid providers to submit required information to participate in the Innovations Direct Care Worker (DCW) provider rate increase that was intended to support increased DCW wages. Providers should reference the Innovations DCW Wage Increase Attestation and Acknowledgment Form, which details the documentation they can use to support and verify that the Innovations DCW Wage Increase funding was used for the benefit of its Innovations DCW.

Per the legislation, Innovations waiver services providers must submit to the relevant Health Plan an annual summary of expenditures, due three months after the respective State Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2024, to validate distribution of Innovations DCW Wage Increase revenue.

For your convenience, please see the <u>Example - Innovations Direct Care Worker Wage</u> <u>End of Year Summary Report</u>, which details how to complete the required report.

For the State Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2024, the <u>Innovations Direct Care Worker Wage</u> <u>End of Year Summary Report</u> is due September 30, 2024.

NCDHHS LAUNCHES STRATEGIC HOUSING PLAN TO EXPAND SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services recently launched the North Carolina <u>Strategic Housing Plan</u> to help maintain, increase and better utilize affordable supportive housing for people with disabilities across the state. This plan addresses housing needs for individuals with disabilities, including those who are currently receiving or eligible for NCDHHS-funded services as well as those who are experiencing homelessness, currently residing in congregate settings or at risk of entry into these settings.

SUBSTANCE USE WORKFORCE CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Governor's Institute, through the DMHDDSUS, will fund requests for continuing education in an effort to further enhance knowledge, skills, and abilities of treatment providers for individuals seeking recovery from substance use disorders.

This initiative provides funds for individuals who are working to complete graduate-level education and are working towards their Licensed Clinical Addiction Specialist (LCAS) certification, in addition to another licensure.

SURVEY INTERVIEW OPPORTUNITY TO IMPROVE EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Inclusion Works of The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services is conducting a study to understand current supported employment options for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) in North Carolina. They are seeking input from people who have I/DD and firsthand experience with these services to participate in an interview.

Your feedback will be crucial in helping them develop a new, person-centered Strategic Plan for Inclusion Works, aimed at promoting Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE). CIE enables individuals with I/DD to work in jobs alongside people without disabilities in their communities.

REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS: PSYCHOSOCIAL REHABILITATION – CURRITUCK AND DARE COUNTIES

Trillium is seeking providers experienced in the treatment of Psychosocial Rehabilitation to expand Medicaid Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR) – Currituck and Dare counties. Only one provider can be selected for each county, but the applicant can apply for one or both counties.

These Requests for Proposal (RFP) is open to both in-network and out-of-network providers enrolled in NC Tracks and NC Medicaid who are free of contract sanctions, fraud investigations, and/or current IRS liens.

The RFPs are being used as a means to obtain information about providers who are capable of providing these services to adults. It should not be interpreted as a contract

(implicit, explicit or implied), nor does it imply any form of an agreement to any potential candidate. In addition, no inference should be made that Trillium will purchase and/or implement in the future any of the programs or services proposed by the respondents.

AUGUST'S ROADMAP 2 READY

Part of being prepared is to have a plan for any kind of emergency. We will be providing best practices on preparedness to help your organization. This month we are giving you information on Hazard Vulnerability Analysis.

Please <u>complete this document</u> if you wish to notify us of your interest in joining our Shelter Response Team. You must complete all the required fields and submit this document to let us know of your interest. Hazard vulnerability analysis (HVA) and risk assessment are organized approaches to identifying hazards or risks that are most likely to have an impact on a healthcare facility and the surrounding community. Conducting a risk assessment / HVA is a requirement in the CMS Emergency Preparedness Rule. When you put strategies in place to reduce the impact of those events you are mitigating and reducing the amount of time it could take to recover. See links and image below on how to calculate your risks.

Emergency plans should include:

- Natural hazards (tornadoes & hurricanes),
- technological hazards (Power outages & cyberattack),
- manmade hazards (missing person & person with a weapon).

There are <u>tools</u>, <u>templates</u> and <u>excel forms</u> available here. Once your risk assessment is completed, it is suggested to review with your team yearly and include strategies for addressing emergency events identified.

NCDHHS ANNOUNCES NC MEDICAID MANAGED CARE CHILDREN AND FAMILIES SPECIALTY PLAN

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services has announced Blue Cross Blue Shield NC was selected as the health plan to serve as the Children and Families Specialty Plan.

The new plan is the latest addition to NC Medicaid Managed Care. The Children and Families Specialty Plan is a single, statewide health plan designed to support Medicaid-enrolled children, youth and families currently and formerly served by the child welfare system in receiving seamless, integrated, and coordinated health care. The first Children and Families Specialty Plan contract term will last four years.

The Children and Families Specialty Plan will cover a comprehensive array of physical health, behavioral health, pharmacy, long term services and supports and Intellectual/ Developmental Disability (I/DD) services and will address unmet health-related resource needs.

Benefits include all basic services offered by NC Medicaid and most services covered by Behavioral Health I/DD Tailored Plans, including 1915(i) home and community-based services.

NCTRACKS MULTI-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION (MFA) UPDATES COMING SOON

In accordance with the <u>North Carolina Identity Management (NCID) Citizen Identity Project</u>, NCTracks is changing the User Login process and implementing Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) updates. Please complete the following steps to update your NCID profile by **Sept. 6, 2024**, in advance of the MFA updates:

These instructions are for Individual and Business users only, not Local and State Government users.

- **1.** Login to the MyNCID portal at https://myncid.nc.gov/ with your NCID Username and Password.
- 2. You will see the Profile Information page upon successful login.
- 3. Click on the MFA tab on your profile page.
- **4.** Click on the **ADD ENROLLMENT** button on the bottom right.
- **5.** A pop-up window will appear prompting you to choose an MFA method. *Please note that office phone extensions are not supported.*
- 6. Follow the onscreen prompts to add your chosen MFA method.

STATE-FUNDED SUBSTANCE ABUSE INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT AND COMPREHENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAM RATES

Trillium Health Resources (Trillium) received a bulletin from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) regarding the State-Funded Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient Program (SAIOP) and Substance Abuse Comprehensive Outpatient Treatment (SACOT) Services.

This bulletin outlines new rate increases for these state-funded services. Currently, Trillium is reviewing the financial impact prior to making any changes to rates; further communication will be forthcoming.

PERCEPTIONS OF CARE SURVEY

Every year Trillium Health Resources and other Tailored Plans (TP) across the state assist the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) with a mandatory annual survey of members who receive Mental Health and/or Substance Use services. The survey is designed to assess member perceptions of the services they have received in the past year.

The survey results are sent to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for required reporting, who then publish the results by TP in an annual report. The survey results are used to inform policy decisions designed to improve the system.

Perceptions of Care Survey Information Link

If you provide MH and/or SU services to members of any age, you may be contacted to participate in the administration of this survey. Specific instructions will be provided by Trillium staff prior to survey administration.

Survey administration options include use of electronic/web based and paperless surveys. These are intended to safeguard members and provider health and safety and to significantly reduce burden for participating providers who assist with the survey administration.

Administration of the 2024 Perceptions of Care survey will occur from <u>August 12-September 20, 2024</u>. Since there is a short administration period, surveys must be completed in a timely manner.

Requirements for Member Participation in the Survey:

- Must have mental health and/or substance use diagnosis
- Must be a Trillium member, with a Trillium member ID number
- Can be State-funded OR Medicaid funded

As a reminder, survey administration may not be billed as a service; rather, survey participation is an element of a provider's contractual requirements with the TP, and ultimately helps to improve the quality of services for our members. Please follow all timelines and survey administration instructions provided by Trillium.
