EARLY AND PERIODIC SCREENING, DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT REQUIRED SERVICES AND COVERAGE

The assigned primary care provider (PCP) is responsible for Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) services, including screening, diagnosis and treatment. Screening services include:

- Routine physical examinations as recommended and updated by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) "Guidelines for Health Supervision III" and described in "Bright Futures: Guidelines for Health Supervision of Infants, Children and Adolescents."
 - A Screening for developmental delays at each visit through the age 5.
 - A Screening for Autism Spectrum Disorders per AAP guidelines.
- 2. Health and development history.
- **3.** Unclothed physical exam.
- 4. Development assessment and behavioral health screening.
- **5.** Assessment and provision of immunizations as appropriate for age and health history, in accordance with the schedule for pediatric vaccines established by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
- 6. Assessment of nutrition status.
- 7. Vision testing.
- **8.** Hearing testing.
- **9.** Laboratory procedures appropriate for age and population groups, including blood lead screening.
- **10.** Oral health assessments, evaluations, prophylaxis and oral hygiene counseling for all children at preventive visits at regular intervals and in accordance with the state Oral Health Periodicity Schedule.
- **11.** Infant members under age 1 must be referred to a dentist or dental professional working under the supervision of a dentist as part of the Medicaid Fee-for-Service program.
- **12.** Anticipatory guidance and health education.
- **13.** Referral for additional services, if indicated, for further diagnosis and treatment services.

Trillium will ensure and verify that network behavioral health providers coordinate with Primary Care Providers and specialists conducting EPSDT screenings. Trillium will not make an adverse benefit determination on a service authorization request for a child until the request is reviewed.



FEDERAL UPDATE: FROM KELLY CROSBIE, MSW, LCSW, DIRECTOR

A MESSAGE FROM DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND SUBSTANCE USE SERVICES

Thank you for your on-going dedication and commitment to serving the people and communities of North Carolina. I thank you for supporting people with significant mental health, substance use and problem gambling, intellectual and developmental disabilities, and traumatic brain injury in all of our communities. I wanted to share some updates with you; unfortunately, the information is slim; but I wanted you to know that we are thinking of you all and so we are sharing what we do know.

DHHS continues to receive all federal funding and grant payments as expected. There have been some instances of payment delays, but this has not been a widespread issue nor lasted for an extended period of time. In addition, we received a new Notice of Award (NOA) for the first quarter of our new SUPTRS Block Grant. (yay!)

Temporary restraining orders remain in place blocking the freezing of federal funds. We continue to monitor and track all federal funding sources daily and will keep you posted if there are significant concerns or issues. There continues to be uncertainty within the federal workforce due to layoffs and resignations. It is not clear what the direct or long-term impact will be on the work of the Department.

March 14 is the deadline for a federal funding bill or continuing resolution to be passed to avoid a federal shutdown. We are working to understand possible impacts now so we can be prepared if there is a shutdown in the next few weeks. While we have approached the possibility of a federal shutdown in the past, the on-going changes at the federal level create additional uncertainty of how to navigate a potential shutdown.

We will continue to provide updates and welcome any feedback on what information is helpful to you and those that you support. The work of administering public dollars and making sure that we are providing programs and services remains vitally important.

Family Navigators partner with families, caregivers, and members to provide an array of formal and informal services and supports so that members can achieve their full potential and are able to live successfully in their community. Family Navigator services can be provided in individual or group settings, in person, by phone, or virtually. Importantly, Family Navigators are parents or care givers of loved ones with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) or traumatic brain injury (TBI) and bring that lived experience navigating systems and accessing resources.

The CIDD is a comprehensive center providing multidisciplinary clinical services, conducting basic to applied research, conducting clinical and research training and engaging in advocacy, all with the goal of improving the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities and their families throughout North Carolina and across the country.

Disaster plans must be submitted through the following link: <u>2025 Disaster Plan</u> <u>Submission</u>.

To confirm your disaster plan was received just check the "send me a copy of my responses" option at the end of the Disaster Plan Submission form.

Disaster Plans are due *May 1, 2025*. Even if no updates are needed to your 2025 Disaster Plan, you *MUST* still resubmit the plan with a new cover page displaying the current year and disaster contact info. Failure to submit your Disaster Plan by the deadline (May 1, 2025), may result in an audit and/or plan of correction.

The U.S. <u>Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)</u> posted guideline requirements for all entities that receive Medicaid funds and this applies to all of our Medicaid providers. For your reference, we have attached the <u>Final Rule</u> that will assist you in locating the requirements to the federal rules that apply to each of your situations.

Our contract with providers requires that you have adequate disaster planning and training process in place within your organization. We know that the best way to cope when a disaster strike is preparation. Please connect with your local emergency management office, know your local hazards and resources, and stay connected with Trillium in the event of an emergency.
