Board Comments Comments/Concern	Vice Chairperson Hunt provided information on House Resolution 3649-the Veterans National Traumatic Brain Injury Treatment Act brought forth by Congressman Greg Murphy. Ms. Hunt encouraged all to support the resolution. Ms. June Cummings requested information on the South Central Regional Advisory Board Bylaws. Ms. Victoria Jackson stated that the current structure is for each region to have a set of Bylaws. One of the key factors for the Bylaws is to ensure that they follow the Bylaws of the Governing Board. The Governing Board Bylaws have not been finalized. After discussion, it was decided that the Bylaws of the other regions not be reviewed until the Governing Board Bylaws are finalized. It was suggested that after the Governing Board establishes their Bylaws, the South Central Regional Board receive copies of Bylaws from the other four regions.

She expressed concern that CFAC is not represented on the Governing Board. She also reported that due to their advocacy efforts, the State has tabled the

N	She stated that communication is critical during a consolidation of this nature and warm hand offs are still occurring between the regions. She reported provider and member office hours were held to share information about the consolidation with providers, members, and families.			
	Ms. Jackson provided information on the Tailored Plan, Trillium will manage physical health and behavioral health services for members, including pharmacy, long term support services, and non-emergency medical transportation.			
	To meet the July 1, 2024, launch date, enrollment in Tailored Plans is set to begin April 13, 2024. Other milestones will continue through May 23, 2024.			
	She reported Trillium received notice of Interim Health Plan accreditation achievement from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA). This is a major accomplishment and Tailored Plan requirement.			
	Ms. Jackson offered training on the Tailored Plan.			
	Ms. Jackson reported the Regional Advisory Board has representation from all counties in the region.			
	Ms. Jackson stated that orientation for Regional Advisory Board members has begun and will continue for the newly elected members.			
	She reported Trillium's Regional Vice Presidents present a program update to each county annually. Most presentations have already been scheduled.			
	Participation in local community meetings continues through the Regional Vice President, Directors of Community Engagement and Empowerment, and Community Liaison Coordinators. In the month of February, there were 288 community engagements across Trillium's forty six county catchment area with eighty occurring within the South Central Region.

SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL VICE PRESIDENT REPORT

South Central Regional Advisory Board May 28, 2024

A. Tailored Plan Update

- The LME/MCOs have undergone readiness reviews to become BH/IDD Tailored Plan
- Auto-enrollment for Tailored Plan members is expected to begin on April 15th.
- The last day for a Tailored Plan member to choose their Primary Care Physician is May 15th and auto-assignment for the Primary Care Physician of a Tailored Plan member is expected to begin on May 16th.
- Packets and information are expected to go out to Tailored Plan members beginning on May 23rd.
- It is reported that 91-95% of the Tailored Plan members are able to stay with their current Primary Care Physician.

B. Healthy Opportunities Program Update

Trillium Health Resources will launch the <u>Healthy Opportunities Pilot program</u> in 15 of our counties on May 15, 2024. The pilot will cover a select set of non-medical, evidence-based services for highrisk health plan members. Services address housing, interpersonal safety, food, and transportation to improve the health and well-being of members. The Pilot program, launched by NCDHHS, will leverage findings to integrate interventions that improve health outcomes into the NC Medicaid program statewide. Pilot services are only available to certain health plan members.

The following counties in Trillium's region are included in the pilot:

- Bladen, Columbus, Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender, and Onslow (services coordinated by Community Care of the Lower Cape Fear)
- Beaufort, Bertie, Chowan, Edgecombe, Halifax, Hertford, Martin, Northampton, and Pitt (services coordinated by <u>Access East, Inc.</u>)

From April 1st-May 17th: 381 engagements completed across Trillium's 46 county catchment area with 89 completed within the South Central region.




- Form can be submitted by member or care manager
